
Zoning Bylaw Update

This item is carried over from the 2017 strategic plan – work on it was suspended due to wildfire activity during the summer/fall of 2017.

The Village of Clinton has completed a Sustainability Plan and an update to the Official Community Plan. The next step is to complete the upgrade to the Zoning Bylaw.

A Zoning Bylaw puts the vision of the Official Community Plan into practical, legalistic terms. In approving these types of Bylaws, elected officials establish different zones in the community and provide guidelines on what type of development and buildings are permitted in each zone.

This information is key for development/growth.



Economic Development 5-Year Marketing Plan

After completing a very successful marketing initiative that identified 6 potential investment opportunities in Clinton, and creating the collateral to support this in 2017, a long range plan to promote the Village is now required.

This plan will chart the course of economic development in the Village and, as always, will include public input.

High Speed Internet

It is widely recognized that in order to attract work from home residents and enable e-commerce a reliable high speed internet is required. Clinton currently has 3 wireless providers but would like to see a fiber-based service.

This project will investigate the options available to Clinton and result in a business case to present to the potential partners in this endeavour.



Public Works Building

In 2017, a 4 year project was commenced to provide the Village with a much needed new public works building.

To date, a location has been selected and an expression of interest issued. This year we will identify cost and design (design will include conventional and green options) and then look for grant funding.

If grant funding cannot be secured we have planned in the budget to have enough money in 2020 to complete the project. Funding will come from gas tax, community forest, and other funding sources.



Park Plan – Update

While a park plan was completed for Reg Conn Park in 2015, it is now out of date. The acquisition of land adjacent to Reg Conn park and the new public works building planned to occupy some of the land in Elliott Park, requires an update to the plan.

The plan will investigate liability issues and include a decision on the pond in Reg Conn Park, facilities for children in both parks, and a road allowance to stop the need for people to use the parking lot in Reg Conn as a road.



Emergency Plan Update

The wildfires in the summer of 2017 hit home. The Village needs to be proactive relating to an Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) and staffing, as well as updating our Emergency Evacuation Plan and create a Wildfire Protection Plan.

We will RFP the work, seek grant funding, and target completion by the summer of 2018 so as to be ready for any possible repeat of last summer.

Other Major Activities

Main Waterline Replacement – the waterline that runs from the treatment plant to the Village is at least 65 years old and is well past its life expectancy. The wildfires of 2017 held up completion of this work; it will be completed in 2018.

With monies earned during the fire fighting aspect of the wildfires, we generated funds and hope to purchase a new **Road Rescue Truck for the Fire Department** – which is the Fire Department's number one priority.

As always we will continue to work with our **First Nations** neighbours to our mutual benefit. This year we hope to foster a relationship with the Bonaparte and Canoe Creek Bands, and we continue to work with High Bar First Nation and The Clinton Indian Band.
