

#### Re: 2022 Community Chipping Event

The Clinton and District Community Forest is once again holding a community chipping event here in Clinton on September 24, 2022. This free community clean up event will allow residents to clear hazardous debris from their properties preventing fire hazards and promoting FireSmart practices.

Residents wishing to participate will be asked to sign up for pick-up and pile their debris at the curb. On September 24, 2022 Asplundh Canada will pick up the debris, chip it and haul it away. Residents will be advised not to put debris out at the curb any earlier than Thursday, September 22, 2022 so as not to cause any obstruction or hazards.

The Board would like to request the use of Elliott Park as a potential site to store the chips for subsequent removal. Ideally, the Board hopes to provide the chips back to the public for gardening or other purposes.

THAT Council approve staff to move forward with arranging the acceptance of e-transfer funds at the Integris Credit Union for the purposes of receiving payments for property tax and utility payments.

#### Background:

Over the last few years it has become very clear that property owners are in need of an alternative method of payment to pay their tax or utility accounts other than in person at the Village Office or through online banking if you are a member of a credit union. We do not accept credit card payments because of the extra charges associated with this service. The next alternative would be to accept e-transfers for tax and utility payments. Any bank associated transactions require two signatures but e-transfer transactions do not require authorization for funds to be deposited into an account. Therefore, permission is required from Council to allow the use of the e-transfer function and the acceptance of funds. There is no risk involved as the e-transfer function would only be used to accept funds not disperse them.

#### **Financial Impacts:**

There are no service charges for the use of e-transfer.
