Flood & slope instability: Evacuation Alert information for residents



YOUR PROPERTY IS IN AN AREA OF INCREASED RISK

Residents in the identified area around McDonald Avenue

REMAIN UNDER AN EVACUATION ALERT

due to the risk of flooding and slope instability.

YOU DO NOT NEED TO EVACUATE AT THIS TIME.

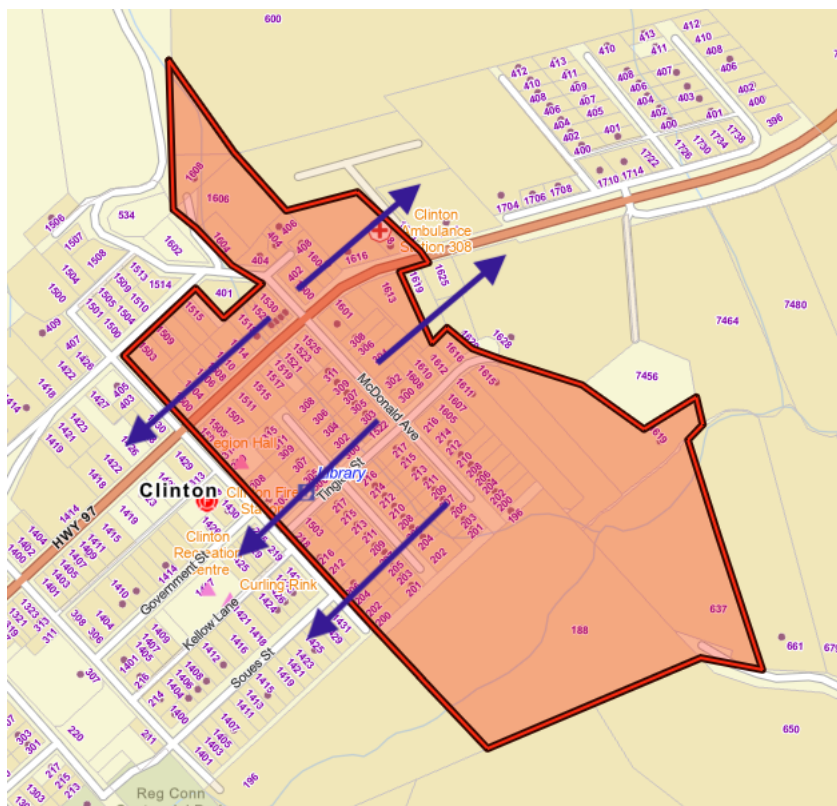
KNOW WHICH WAY TO GO

Residents in this area have specific evacuation directions because of the Clinton Creek risk.

NORTH of McDonald Avenue → HEAD NORTH

SOUTH of McDonald Avenue → HEAD SOUTH

In the event of an evacuation, Do NOT travel toward McDonald Avenue or through the identified hazard area.



ABOUT THE FLOOD RISK

Flood risk and slope instability in the area was identified before the Pear Lake wildfire.

The wildfire has increased this existing risk.

Loss of vegetation and changes to the ground can increase runoff during rainfall and make it easier for ash, soil, branches and other debris to move into Clinton Creek.

One area of particular concern is where Clinton Creek passes beneath the railway embankment.

Debris carried downstream could block the existing culvert, causing water to accumulate and increasing the potential for flooding, erosion and slope instability.

IF AN EVACUATION IS REQUIRED: LEAVE IMMEDIATELY

Follow Voyent Alert! and emergency instructions.

Do not wait until you can see flooding, moving debris or a slope failure before leaving.

WHAT IS CLINTON DOING ABOUT THIS?

The Village has taken immediate action to reduce the risk.

Staff have been working with geotechnical engineers, the TNRD, CN Railway and other project partners to assess and monitor conditions and identify additional measures to remediate the risk. This includes initiating work to help prevent debris from reaching and blocking the railway culvert, and leading project planning on longer-term solutions.

WHAT DO I NEED TO DO NOW?

Be prepared to leave quickly if conditions change.

1. Keep your phone nearby and make sure you can receive Voyent Alert! notifications.
2. Keep identification, medications, important documents and essential items ready.
3. Have a plan for pets and animals.
4. Make sure everyone in your household knows which direction to travel.
5. Contact the Clinton EOC if you may need assistance evacuating.

**Be particularly alert during and after periods of rainfall,
when runoff may move ash, soil, branches and other debris into Clinton Creek.**

STAY INFORMED

Sign up for **Voyent Alert!** for emergency notifications and updates.
